To All.

Since the last bulletin several issues have come to light namely scams and reported incidents of horses manes being plaited

There are a number of scams being perpetrated around the country. In all cases those "selling" the scam are after one thing ...your money!! There is no such thing as a "free lunch" and if someone is asking you to do something which involves a cost to you examine what is being said or read very carefully before embarking on a course of action. If in doubt say no and ask a friend for advice......!

Two Scams currently doing the rounds

The below was received from Sussex Horsewatch and is important to note this one especially if you have elderly or vulnerable relatives make sure they do not fall into the trap of making premium rate phone calls

Postal Scam

It has been confirmed by Royal Mail. The Trading Standards Office are making people aware of it The scam goes like this.....

A card is posted through your door

From a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a

Premium rate number). DO NOT call this number, as this is a mail scam

Originating from Belize. If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will Already have been billed £15 for the phone call.

Details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 02072396655 or ICSTIS (the

Premium rate service regulator) at

Another scam as described below.....

An equine physiotherapist received a phone call from a male claiming to be from Hampshire Police. He stated he was compiling a brochure re: horse thefts and required sponsors. She was then contacted by a male claiming to be from the artwork company who took her personal bank details. Money was debited from her account, prior to her being alerted by A.C.P.A. her governing body, advising her of a possible scam. A few days later, she received another call from a male claiming again to be from Hampshire Police. She told him he had already contacted her and requested his phone number. He became obstructive and hung up.

Hampshire Constabulary through its media department have issued a press release disassociating itself from the alleged sponsoring. See below

Horse owners in Hampshire are being warned by police to be wary of scam phone calls from a magazine requesting sponsorship money.

Hampshire police were alerted to the scam after an equine physiotherapist was called on 17 November by a man claiming

to be collecting sponsorship for a magazine against horse crime. The man said he was from Hampshire police, but

force has confirmed that it is not involved in any such magazine. The physiotherapist gave the caller her bank details and

money was debited from her account before police were aware of the scam. People are advised to contact police if they

receive similar phonecalls on 0845 045 45 45.

Plaiting

As many of you will know they is an unprecedented number of reports being received from different parts of the country about horses' manes being plaited.

The overriding question is why? In short there is no given answer. Depending who is spoken to the answer may be that the plaits indicate the horse has been identified for stealing. Others will say that the plaiting coincides with the time of the year, position of the sun, moon and that the plaits are symbols of others beliefs, rites and rituals. On the other hand the plait may be the result of natural movement of the

horse combined with its close contact with hedges, gorse. These "plaits" can have colloquial names such as tigs, twassels, teesels, torgs.......

All plaiting incidents need to be examined individually and a decision on what to do made on facts as identified. It would help if all plaiting incidents were photographed so that within each county a log is maintained. This would help to appreciate exactly what plaits look like and determine their relevance

It is probably best to keep an open mind about the plait debate as it does not help the equine community to create a fear of crime if none is justified. This was demonstrated recently when a horse was allegedly reported stolen from Guildford, found abandoned outside the port of Holyhead, with a plait in its mane! Subsequent investigation revealed there was no theft, therefore no abandonment or plait.

As with all matters affecting horses and property the over riding message is remain vigilant, be suspicious and report all matters causing concern to your local police and Horsewatch.

Future Forwarding of information

Messages relating to crime received into Hampshire for inclusion onto the bulletin must be accompanied by a crime reference number and an officer in case name with the appropriate contact details

Additionally messages relating to crimes or incidents must include a full geographical location description. The sender may know where a village is located but it is not always apparent on the receiving end!! If there is little information to go on then it may not appear in the bulletin!!

Hampshire and other counties are experiencing thefts of york stone from properties either laid or stored.

In response to this, Hampshire Constabulary is running an operation in order to gather information and target the offenders.

Keep a vigilant eye and inquisitive mind when you see suspicious persons or vehicles in your area and make a note of the vehicle, its registration and visual of the person where appropriate.

If you are approached by a person at your property making enquiries or offering services, ask them for a card and or details. The card will have their fingerprints on it, so please handle the card at the edge and store the card in a clean bag and contact the given number below. We will endeavour to collect the card/paper at the earliest opportunity.

Please make a note of eye colour, hair colour and length. Height and age of person. Did they have an accent or walking style? What were they wearing? Right handed or left? Etc. If you are able to remember any information about the person, this would help us to ascertain the offender.

As a crime prevention measure consider using Smartwater on your stone slabs on the top in a corner area with the liquid. Details of how to purchase this product can be found on the internet.

Consider the 3 in 1 digital security light cameras or similar.

Can you make it difficult for thieves to steal your property rather than easy i.e. secured gates, box the stone in with vehicles?
